

Introduction to the Bilateral Social Agreement Contract

In our American history prior to our Revolution , local assemblies, known as Committee's of Safety, first wrote out their grievances against the crown, and used that as the founding document that created their safety committees. Most of those grievances were later turned into the Constitution and Bill of Rights.

Each county will be provided with a Bilateral Social Compact Agreement (BSCA) to use as a starting point for your county. The provided BSCA was developed by members and volunteers of the Republic for the united States of America from many states. This version was provided to the Alabama free State by the FL Republic Officers.

Tip for ease of development - keep the writings short, general and directly to the point; leave out all emotions and useless descriptive language; get down to the simplest words, such as "freedom of speech", or "right to bear arms". Avoid unnecessary details.

The immediate business of the County Assembly, after settling the county per the 'Steps to Settle County' file, is to ratify or alter their BSCA and then elect 2 delegates to represent the county in the General Assembly (Legislature) at state level.
